PAIGAH TOMBS

Dating back to the 18th century, Paigah tombs are spread over 30-40 acres of land. They blend the different architectural styles of Asaf Jahi and Rajputani. Built with white marble, the intricate Indo Saracen designs on the tomb attract visitors from diverse quarters. Skillfully carved and inlaid with mosaic tile work, the tombs are breathtaking. The famous 'Jali' work makes it even more attractive

CHOWMAHALLA

Located in the heart of the old city, Chowmahalla was the seat of the Asaf Jahi dynasty and the official residence of the Nizams of Hyderabad while they ruled the state. The palace is adorned with Mughal domes and arches, and numerous Persian elements like the ornate stucco work. More recently, 19 spectacular Chandeliers of Belgian crystal were reinstalled to recreate the lost splendour of this exquisite monument.

MECCA MASJID

It takes its name after the bricks that were brought from Mecca, to build this unique mosque in Hyderabad initially by Sultan Mohammed Qutb Shah and later completed by Mughal Emperor Aurangzeb in 1694. Bricks were utilized to build the main arches of the mosque. This place is also the burial ground of the Nizams and their family members.

QUTUB SHAHI TOMBS

A short walk from the fort leads to a cluster of tombs built for the kings of the Qutub Shahi Dynasty. They are domed structures built on a square base surrounded by pointed arches, a distinctive style that blends Persian and Indian forms. The tombs display intricately carved stonework and are surrounded by landscaped gardens.

HUSSAIN SAGAR LAKE

Built in 1562, Hussain Sagar Lake has the majestic monolithic Buddha statue erected at its heart. As one of the largest man-made lakes in India, it connects the twin cities of Hyderabad and Secunderabad. This perhaps is the only manmade lake in India situated perfectly in the middle of a state. There are boating facilities available here.

BIRLA MANDIR

Birla Mandir is an enchanting modern temple built atop the Kala Pahad, the twin hillock of the Naubat Pahad. The inner shrine of the temple has an 11 ft tall idol of Lord Sri Venkateswara. The temple also houses consorts of Lord Venkateswara, Goddess Padmavati and Goddess Andal as well as a separate shrine dedicated to Lord Buddha.

The Salar Jung Museum is one of the three national museums of India and is considered to house the largest one-man collection. Nawab Mir Yusuf Ali Khan Salar Jung III (1889-1949) spent over 35 years curating this priceless collection which includes sculptures, carpets, clocks, and furniture from Japan, China, Burma, Nepal, India, Persia, Egypt, Europe and North America. The most famous among the sculptures are "Veiled Rebecca" and "Mephistopheles".

Most of these artifacts belong to the ancient and medieval periods such as the Satavahanas and the Ikshvakus. Some of the enticing works of art here comprise of the Buddhist and Jain relics, Arms and Armoury gallery, Numismatists gallery, etc.


Once home to the Nizams, this 'old palace' is today a museum that houses a rare and wide array of gifts that the last Nizam Mir Osman Ali Khan, Asaf Jahi VII received from dignitaries of various states and countries on his silver jubilee celebrations in 1936. A golden wooden throne, gold box inlaid with diamonds, miniature replica of Jubilee Hall, a glass inlay painting of the Nizam, a wooden writing box studded with mother-of-pearl, diamond and gold-studded daggers are just some of what's on display here.

The park which got its name from the holy Jain Saint Mahavir, has a vast spread of rocks interspersed with tons of greenery. Makara Sankranthi is a Hindu festival celebrated in January every year. The festival, which is celebrated in three days is devoted to the sun god (Surya). The first day is Bhogi, the second day, Makara Sankranthi and the third day, Kanuma. Another major activity during the festival is Kite flying. Recognising the significance, Telangana government organises an International Kite Flying Festival every year on Makara Sankranthi.





Ramzan, which is also known as Ramadan or Ramadhan is the ninth month in the Islamic Calendar. This particular month is observed as the month of fasting by all Muslims to commemorate the first revelation of the Quran to the prophet Muhammad according to Islamic belief, Eid-al-fitr marks the end of Ramzan, This is celebrated with great enthusiasm as special dishes are prepared and friends and relatives are invited home to celebrate the occasion.


