



KARIMNAGAR

Karimnagar, named after Syed Karimuddin, the ertwhile Quilardaar, epitomises the true spirit of secularism. Here, one can find many centres for Vedic learning that have existed since the ancient times. Several shrines of Hindu gods, Jain temples and vestiges of Gautama Buddha were also discovered here. The place is particularly popular for the sculpted wonders in its temple galleries dedicated to various deities: some of which were sculpted over 1000 years ago. The temples are picturesquely nestled in dense forests on the confluence of rivers Godavari and Pranahita. The Buddhist stupas belonging to Satavahana


period, the forts, the wildlife sanctuaries, and tribal arts of Gonds, Koyas, and Chenchus bring a distinct colour to the beauty of Karimnagar.



VEMULAWADA

The place, Vemulawada, is quite popular for the Raja Rajeshwara Swamy temple. The temple attracts devotees from far-flung regions. Built by the Chalukya Kings between 750 AD and 973 AD, the temple complex houses several temple units dedicated to deities like Lord Sri Rama. Goddess Lakshmi, Lord Ganapathy, and Lord Sri Padmanabha Swamy. There are stunning galleries in the complex. The star attractions of the construction are the mirror gallery, Addala Mandapam and a corridor with several Shiva Idols. The temple tank is a main tourist attraction as it is believed that the water here has curative properties. Interestingly, there exists a Muslim Dargah inside the temple complex where devotees, irrespective of caste or creed, offer prayers.









NAGUNUR



This was once the stronghold of Kakatiya Empire. The Chalukyas of Kalyani and the Kakatiyas built several interesting temples during their reign. The most important temple complex is the one with the three shrines i.e.Trikuta. While the main entrance faces East, the three shrines face North. West and South. The temple has interesting carvings of musicians playing mridangam and other instruments. Panels with visuals of dancers in graceful poses are another unique attraction.

SILVER FILIGREE



This is an interesting form of craft practised on Silverware in Karimnagar. It has very delicate and intricate carvings on silver sheets which has many admirers and is famous across the world. The carvings include motifs of birds and flowers. The popular Silver Filigree items include: Traditional pandans, jewellery boxes, vases and replicas of Charminar.





Koti Lingala was the first capital of the Satavahana dynasty. The traditional Sri Koteswara Siddeshwara Swamy Devasthanam temple with picturesque background is about 60 km from the district headquarters town of Karimnagar.



Manthani is a centre for learning of Vedas and Shastras. Located on the banks of River Godavari, this ancient Vedic centre is the alma mater of several scholars who are well-versed in Vedas and Shastras even today. Several temples of repute adorn this land. Among these, Lord Saileswara, Gauthameshwara, Laxminarayana Swamy, Omkalisvaragudi and Mahalaxmi are a few. It is also an important centre for Jainism and Buddhism.
